A board certified behaviour analyst (BCBA) is an independent practitioner trained in the science of applied behaviour analysis. BCBA's teach and support individuals to address learning and behavioural needs using different methods and strategies founded on behavioural principles.

BCBA's assess behaviour in relation to its environment by using systematic approaches involving behavioural assessments, observations and data collection. BCBA's interpret change in behaviour by objectively analyzing data of interventions used to support behavioural change.

BCBA's act in the best interest of their clients by prioritizing their rights and needs in service delivery and implement behaviour change interventions identified as socially significant to clients and stakeholders.
